PhD position Rudolf-Schönheimer Institute of Biochemistry Faculty of Medicine Leipzig University



We are seeking a PhD student to investigate the role of Adhesion GPCRs in adipocyte function.

Adhesion GPCRs are the second largest group of cell surface receptors with their activation and signal transduction mechanism recently identified. They have been associated with several metabolic functions yet their specific role in these processes remains enigmatic. As several Adhesion GPCRs are differentially regulated during adipocyte differentiation and between adipose tissue from lean and obese individuals we aim to study their contribution to these processes.

This PhD project requires experience in cell culture as well as basic molecular biology techniques (DNA and RNA extraction, PCR, reverse Transcription, qPCR). The successful candidate will isolate and work with primary cells, perform signal transduction assays in primary cells and cell lines and investigate adipocyte function by lipolysis, ELISA, and metabolic analysis using the Seahorse technology.

Applicant must hold a Master's or equivalent degree obtained in life sciences. Students are expected to work across disciplines and in cooperation with others. A capacity and willingness to integrate and collaborate is essential.

The Program will start with an initial 6 month stipend which can be prolonged up to 3 years providing a salary of 65 % of a German salary scale TVL-13. The position can start January 2019 but a certain degree of flexibility is possible.
